without their respective wilful default nor the one of them for the other of them or for the arrears payments mismanagement or defaults of the other of them but each of them for their own and his own arrears payments mismanagement and defaults only and also that it shall be lawful for the said Trustees respectively and the survivors and survivor of them and his and their heirs Executors and Administrators from time to time to retain repay and reimburse themselves respectively all such Costs Charges and Expenses and a reasonable satisfaction for all such trouble and pains as they respectively shall pay expend take or be put into in or about the execution of the respective trusts hereby in them reposed and it is my will and particular request that my said nephew John Grouse shall not on any account sell or dispose of any part of my said household Estates or property in the said parish of Alvingmore but suffer the same therein respectively to run out and also request that he will at all times befriend advise and assist my said Executors for as well as his son in the management of their affairs and lastly I hereby revoke all wills and Testaments by me at any time heretofore made in witness whereof I the said John Grouse have to the seven first sheets of this my will contained in eight sheets of paper set my hand and to this last sheet my hand and seal the fifteenth day of November in the year of our Lord One thousand Eight hundred and twenty four. H. Legassick (L.S.) signed sealed published and declared by the above named John Grouse the Testator as and for his last will and Testament contained in eight sheets of paper to the seven first of which he set his hand and to this last sheet his hand and seal in presence of us who at his request in his presence and in the presence of each other have subscribed our names as witnesses thereto these words "or last mentioned" being first interlined John Andrews of Andover Solicitor John Burnell of Bolton ystoman John Sparrow of Alvingmore ystoman

Proved at London 3<sup>rd</sup> June 1826 before the Judge by the Oath of the Reverend John Grouse Clerk the nephew the sole Executor to whom administration was granted having been first sworn by Commission duly administered.

I give and bequeath unto John Paul of Torpoint in the aforesaid parish and County five guineas of lawful money of Great Britain for a mourning ring and twenty guineas of the like lawful money for the trouble he may have in proving this my last will and executing the trusts hereby in him reposed. I give and bequeath to Diana Jones of the City of Bristol five guineas of lawful money of Great Britain if she be living at my decease and I desire that all my just debts and funeral Expenses be paid. I give and bequeath unto Ann Sargent late of Andover but now of Torpoint in the aforesaid parish and County twelve my silver pint and Salver I give and bequeath unto Isabella Rogers widow sister of the said Ann Sargent my remaining watch and all the rest residue and remainder of my plate household goods money stock in the public funds and other Effects of what nature and kind soever or wheresoever I give and bequeath unto the aforesaid Ann Sargent and Isabella Rogers share and share alike but if either of them should die before me then their share to go to the survivor of them and I do hereby nominate and appoint the aforesaid John Paul my sole Executor of this my last will and Testament whereby revoking all former wills by me at any time heretofore made in witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this nineteenth day of March in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and twenty two Penelope Lewis (L.S.) signed sealed published and declared by the said Testatrix Penelope Lewis as and for her last will and Testament in the presence of us who at her request have hereunto subscribed our names as witnesses thereto in the presence of the said Testatrix and in the presence of each other. Proved at London on the third day of June 1826 before the Judge by the Oath of John Paul the sole Executor named in the aforesaid will to whom administration was granted he having been already sworn by Commission well and faithfully to administer.
